

- Before you read, find a *credible* site on literature and read about "magic (or magical) realism." As you read the novel, quickly mark those passages where Esquivel has used this technique. You may use a highlighter, pencil, pen, sticky notes, or any other method of marking the relevant passages.
- Finally, you must bring a special recipe on the first day of school. This must be a recipe you have eaten and connect in your mind to a *specific* memory, good or bad. RECIPES ARE DUE ON DAY 1 OF CLASS. Try to write it on a recipe card or index card if you have one, but notebook paper is fine, too. At the end of the recipe (or on the back), write your name plus a *single adjective* to describe the emotion that is central to this memory. You may use only one word and it must be in adjective form. Strive for the most *precise* adjective you can find; while "happy" "sad" "angry" are indeed adjectives, they are general and a bit dull. You can do better!
