## **Creativity Examples**

- School Play/Musical (as long as it's not part of the student's IB Diploma Program)
- Summer Science Camp/Youth Science Center (teaching younger students in Early Enriched Learning classes)
- Starting your own non-profit organization
- Yearbook (creating page layout and design for the most important and high-profile publication of the year)
- Dance Class/Recitals (students are involved in a variety of dance classes and recital performances)
- Model United Nations (involvement requires a lot of research, debate, speech-writing and giving speeches)
- **Teaching in a foreign country** (one of our students traveled to Indonesia and taught young school children)
- Mock Trial (through trial simulations in competition with teams from other schools, students develop critical thinking and public speaking skills)
- **Debate** (students compete with other schools in giving speeches, formal debate, and extemporaneous speaking)
- Learning and/or teaching a musical instrument
- Community Parade Float Decoration (students volunteer to decorate various parade floats)
- Tutoring
- Cougar Cast-Offs (knitting club for charity)
- ASL Club (volunteer with the American Sign Language Club/teach others sign language)
- Orlando Shakespeare Festival (volunteer for one of the plays)
- Art club (teach an art class or paint a mural for charity)
- NHS Publicity (publicizes service activities for our school's chapter of the National Honor Society)
- Choir (not part of the student's IB Diploma Program)

## **Activity Examples**

- AIDS Walk (AIDS walk to promote awareness and raise money for AIDS research)
- MS Walk (walk to raise money for a cure for Multiple Sclerosis)

- **Recycling** (collecting aluminum, plastic, and paper goods and transporting them to a reclamation center)
- Clean-Up UHS (organize a group to clean-up the campus)

## **Service Examples**

- School Play/Musical
- **Tutoring** (must be in a structured environment with an appropriate adult supervisor)
- Volunteering in a doctor's office (usually the student must be at least 16 years old)
- Starting your own non-profit organization
- Working in a homeless shelter or soup kitchen (must be in a structured environment with an appropriate adult supervisor)
- Invisible Children (motivated by the unseen war in Northern Uganda)
- Volunteering at a retirement or convalescent home
- Beach Cleanup
- Teaching in a foreign country
- Planting trees
- Red Cross

- Swim Instructor (volunteer work to help children ages 6-14 learn how to swim)
- Officer in a school club (student must be active in planning, organizing, and publicizing service projects)
- Holiday Basket: Canned Food Drive (school clubs participate at local canned food drives during the holidays)

- Relay for Life (event to raise money for the American Cancer Society)
- Trash Pickup (on weekends school clubs joined forces to pick up trash on campus)
- **Habitat for Humanity** (seeks to eliminate poverty housing and homelessness from the world and to make decent shelter a matter of conscience and action)
- Basketball Referee
- Barnes & Noble Christmas Gift Wrapping (volunteers wrap books for customers at Barnes & Noble for free during the holidays)
- Pet Rescues (volunteer at a pet rescue)
- Human Society (volunteer to walk dogs and care for animals)
- Recycling (collecting aluminum, plastic, and paper goods and transporting them to a reclamation center)
- **Best Buddies** (Best Buddies is a nonprofit organization dedicated to enhancing the lives of people with intellectual disabilities by providing opportunities for one-to-one friendships and integrated employment)
- **Teaching a musical instrument** (activity must be in a structured environment with an appropriate adult supervisor)
