

At the end of the recipe (or on the back), write your name plus a *single, carefully chosen adjective* to describe the emotion that is central to this memory. You may use only one word and it must be in adjective form. Strive for the most *precise* and expressive adjective you can find. While "happy," "sad," and "angry" are indeed adjectives, they are general and a bit dull. You can do better! ^(C)
